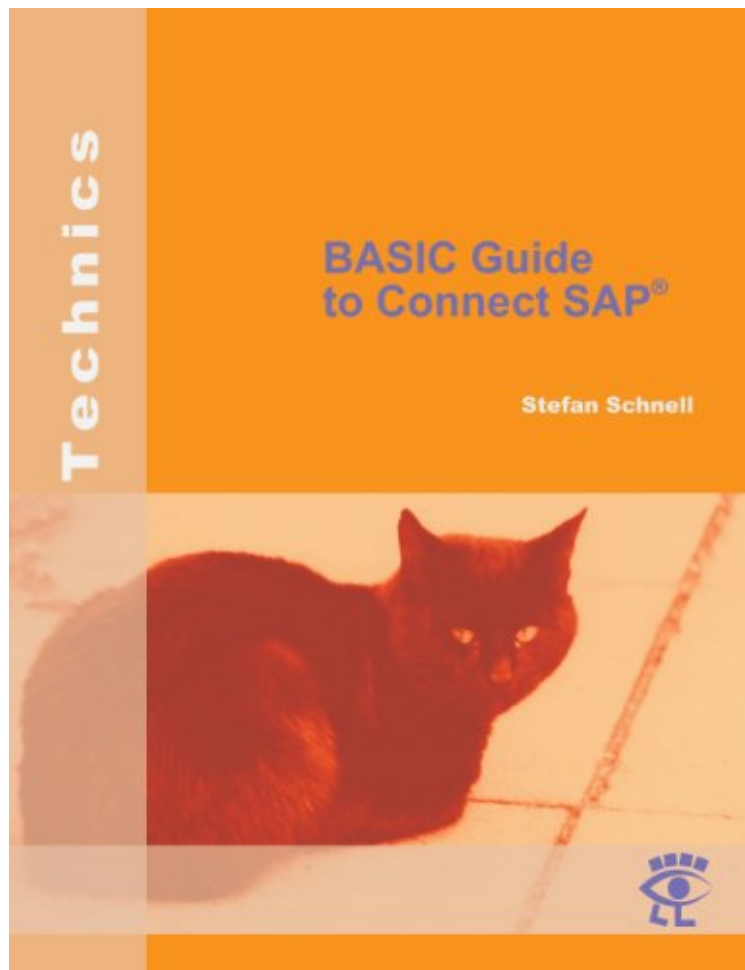

At first Stefan gives useful information about COM modules and RFC SDK.The book then offers a wide variety of how to get connected to SAP, using:- AutoIT- PowerBasic- PureBasic- JabacoThe appendix shows how to use VB script

within ABAP (Appendix A and B). Appendix C demonstrates with FreeBasic how to compile an own windows functions library (DLL) and access it via SAP using DynamicWrapper. Free Basic is - as it's name indicates - free to use. Since PowerBasic and PureBasic are commercial BASIC compilers I concentrated on using the given examples for AutoIT and Jabaco. The code is designed for Windows XP/ Vista but not yet for Windows 7. But the code can be adapted very easily. The AutoIT example report for starting "notepad.exe" via run menu must be adapted for proper work (delete sendKey "U" command for selecting "execute" from run menu). Before executing the AutoIT example for using "paint.exe" to draw a figure the vertical starting point must be increased. Otherwise the report starts to draw in the ribbon... Trying Jabaco was very exciting as this is a free visual basic like compiler. A license key can be received after registering Jabaco. I wondered that the only the 32Bit java classes from SAP - which must be downloaded from the SAP website - worked properly instead of the previous installed 64bit-version I used on my 64bit Windows 7 notebook. Stefan often did surprise me with his unconventional techniques and solutions in bulletin boards. The BASIC Guide to Connect SAP: Practical guide to use SAP systems with different BASIC languages is a great enrichment for every interested SAP programmer who often needs to connect to non-SAP systems. But be careful: If you read this book despite doubts, your personal destiny could change! ;)
