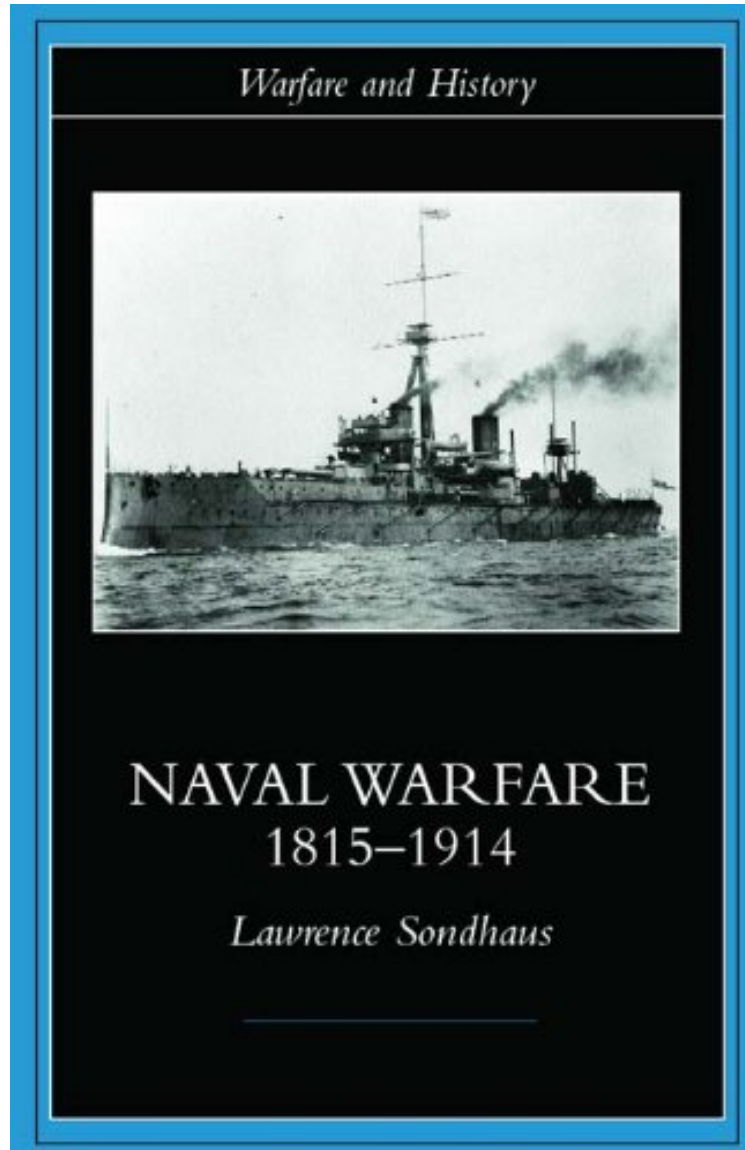

information on the activities of all major naval powers (including those that only became major powers toward the end of the period) during the era of transition from sail to steam. He also addresses some often ignored aspects, such as the naval wars in Latin America, or Russian naval developments. In my view the author gets the balance between political, military (i.e. warfare, strategy, tactics and organisation) and technical aspects just right. I have rarely read more succinct comprehensive study than this book. An ideal introduction to naval warfare in the period from the Vienna Congress to the outbreak of World War One and a useful hand book and reference work for students of military history.
