It is incredible extensive and exhaustive (there are over 600 tales). No wonder it took the author 40 years to gather all the

tales! Buber states on the introduction to this work that the tales included only represents one-tenth of the material in existence! This collection of tales is certainly an interesting source of inspiration for the readers who are embedded in Hassidism or might be a valuable source of information for those who wish to do research on this area; otherwise, the reader will most probably not be able to cope with the magnitude of this worl.
